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ABOUT THE SCHOOL

he white paper on the establishment of this university was first passed into law by the then Ondo State House of Assembly, naming the University as Obafemi Awolowo University. The Governor, Chief M. A. Ajasin, formally announced the appointment of the late Professor Ifedayo O. Oladapo as the pioneer Vice Chancellor and Chief B. A. Ajayi as the first chairman of council on the 19th of February, 1982. Chief J. G. O. Adegbite assumed duty on the 1st of August 1982 as the first Registrar of the University, while Mr. J. A. Arikenbi was appointed as the first Librarian. The first meeting of the Council of the University was held on the 30th and 31st of March, 1982. Since then, the 30th of March every year was declared as the University's Foundation Day.

It is interesting to note that the University started with 136 students and began lectures on the 10th of January 1983 in a rented apartment at the premises of Ajitadun Nursery and Primary School, at Opopogboro, Ado – Ekiti. The University's name changed from Obafemi Awolowo University (OAU) to Ondo State University (OSUA) in June 1985. The University moved from the temporary site to the present permanent site on Ado Ekiti Iworoko Road in August 1985. The name was later changed to the University of Ado Ekiti (UNAD) on 1st of December, 1999 and subsequently to Ekiti State University in July 2011.

Ekiti State University (EKSU), Ado Ekiti, located 7°37'N, 5°15 E in Ekiti State of Nigeria, is a comprehensive public institution of intensive teaching and research in undergraduate and professional programmes in a residential setting. EKSU is dedicated to advancement of knowledge with a view to foster development through innovative research, teaching and learning activities. At EKSU, we recognize the need to be part of creative, innovative intellectual networks by establishing and maintaining existing local Universities in the world.

Ekiti State University is situated on a 3,500 hectares of land, approximately 12km, North of Ado Ekiti, the capital city of Ekiti state, Nigeria. The state which was created in 1996 is the 29th largest of Nigeria's 36 states with a population of 2.4million and an area of 6,353sq km. the state that prides population of itself as the Land of Honour – Ile Iyi, (connoting the sterling attributes of hard work, integrity, honour and honesty of Ekiti indigenes), is predominantly agrarian, linguistically and culturally homogenous, richly endowned in both human and natural resource. The state enjoys a beautiful tropical climate with distinct ramy season (April – October) and dry season (November – March), annual temperature range of between 21°C and 28°C with high relative humdity.

The institution became Ekiti State University in July 2011 from the consolidation of the three erstwhile Universities in Ekiti State namely University of Ado Ekiti (UNAD), University of Science and Technology, Ifaki (USTI) and the University of Education, Ikere Ekiti (TUNEDIK). The University is made up 9 faculties, namely Arts, Education, Sciences, Social Sciences, Management Sciencies, Law, Medicine, Engineering and Agricultural Sciences with many programs like Pre degree, Post graduate, Sandwich etc.
